1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Ram Tahal Choudhary College adheres to prescribed Syllabus & Academic calendar of Ranchi University. The college has received recognition and affiliation from the Govt. of Jharkhand and the Ranchi University for the subjects such as **Arts**- History, Political Science, Sociology, Economics, Psychology, Philosophy, Geography, Anthropology, Home Science, Hindi, Urdu, Sanskrit, English, Khortha, Nagpuri, Kurmali, Santhali, **Commerce**-Accounts.

The courses conducted in The College are designed by the Ranchi University. These are four years' degree programme for Arts and Commerce stream. Ethics and morals values are taught to the students by their concerned faculties and also by inviting resource person to enlighten them. During the orientation programs special classes are taken for girls and boys to stress the needs of respect for each student and gender equality. Moral Science classes are conducted for all the students to inculcate in them human values, to promote a value based life. Some of those values are presented to them through the vision-mission and core values of the college. The college promotes gender equality, love and respect for all human beings irrespective of gender, class, caste and creed.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The college plans and organizes the teaching, learning and evaluation schedules according to the guidelines provided by Ranchi University. Support structures and systems are available for teachers to develop skills like interactive learning, collaborative learning and independent learning. The college makes efforts to ensure

students' growth and development in a congenial classroom atmosphere. Students are provided with opportunities for academic interactions such as workshops and group discussions which help in interactive and collaborative learning. Digital Library facility is provided to all students as per norms decided by the library committee of the college.

For internal assessment, the entire department usually conduct their sessional examination individually. The schedule of sessional examination has been decided as per the academic calendar of the affiliating university. Sessional examination and evaluation work is regulated by the college itself. The institution has a direct process of continuous internal evaluation to evaluate the learning capacities of the students. In all the subjects where practical exams are part of the curriculum, it is mandatory to submit a practical record that is evaluated and marks are added during the final consolidation of results. Periodical class tests are also conducted on regular basis which help the students in their preparation for the final exam. Teachers, who are in the examination panel of the college render their services in setting the question paper and evaluating, answer books. The evaluation process is transparent. The assessment work is carried out by the concerned subject faculty in the institution. The evaluation reports are prepared within the stipulated time and communicated to the students and suggest them necessary improvement steps. The external assessment is done as per the norms prescribed by the affiliating university. The examination schedule, examination paper, the centre of examination and the evaluation procedure are all managed by the University. For any student grievance, the college consider their problem and forward it to the concerned authorities of the affiliating universities and try to get it resolve in a timely manner.

Research, Innovations and Extension

For the holistic development of students Ram Tahal Choudhary College provides opportunity for actively participate in social issues. For the encouragement of Innovation and entrepreneurship among the students, various MoU have been signed by the college with various different types of institutions to promote skill development program. In the college campus, 'DAKSYA ACADEMY PVT. LTD.' provides free fashion designing course for students under 'Mukhyamantri Sarthi Yojana'. Like this another centres are also established in the college campus, with the name 'Sri Sri Kaushal Vikas Kendra'. This centre provides various type of training related to electrical work.

Also college does some inspirational workshop and seminar for students to inspire for Innovation. "Kaushal Vikas Samman Samaroh" is one such type of program. In this program college honours and promotes grass-root level or local level person whose works results in promotion of innovation and innovative ideas which are backed by the success. These types of program motivate students for research and innovation and acts as a tool for encouragement.

The College provides opportunities for active participation in awareness program related to social and local issues for the holistic development of students. NCC and NSS wings of college are mostly involved and responsible for the extension and out-reached activities from time to time. For the development of sensibility/sensitivity about social issues in students college conducted different extension activities. Objective of these activities is to impact & influence and also make them aware about the neighbourhood community by the students involvement and active participations. However, the main objective of these extension activities is to achieve the process of holistic development of students. Cancer Awareness Rally, Road Safety Awareness Rally, De-addiction Rally are some of the activities organised by the college with the help of students and faculties. Also, for the awareness of healthy habits, college celebrate 'Yoga Day', 'World Environment Day', 'Vriksha Rakshabandhan', 'Maati Mahotsva' every year to inspire our students and people from local

communities.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The College has provided adequate physical infrastructure and updated academic facilities as per the requirement of Stake holders and need of the students. The outward look of an educational institution is the best of its kind with fencing around the College with a pond also. The college has state of the art infrastructure for educational facilities for its students to materialize their learning expression like smart classes, laboratories, conference hall, auditorium, common room for boys & separate common room exclusively for girls, power backups with 30 kva DG set, cafeteria, yoga room, medical room, etc.

The campus is Wi-Fi-enabled with two different Internet connection of 100 Mbps each from two different vendors BSNL and Jio. The college campus is under continuous CCTV Cameras surveillance 24x7. Our College Garden consists of herbal, floral plants & an eco-friendly pond. Yoga practice and cultural competitions are conducted on regular basis in every academic session. The college has prepared Volley Ball court, Kabaddi court, Kho-Kho tracks for Athletic events and provides open space for yoga practice.

The college has one of the best libraries among Ranchi University, Ranchi. It came into existence along with the foundation of the college. The college library is fully automated and bar coded with around 9500 plus books and a well-maintained reading room with seating capacity of 45 students and a separate reading area for 15 teachers. The college library has subscription of 9 different daily newspapers. The Librarian seeks departmental requirement to purchase useful books. After arrival of the new books, their titles are shared on departmental channels and also displayed on new arrival section.

Student Support and Progression

Ram Tahal Choudhary College have arranged to get scholarship for students through government bodies under government scheme like "savitri-bai phule scheme" by social-welfare department for girls students and "post-matric scholarship scheme" by E-Kalyan department for our students.

The college also has initiated various skill based non curricular course for the students of the college like Yoga program, Communication program and other skill based program form organisation which follows NSDC Guidelines and listed in Jharkhand government skill program list. The college provides various others facilities for cultural and sporting events for holistic development of the students of the college.

The Institute has a registered Alumni Association for building strong bond between alumni and present students. The alumni give support to the students through interaction, financial funding, guidance and placement. The mission of the Alumni Association is to foster a mutually beneficial relationship between the Institute and its alumni.

Alumni are resources that can provide meaningful and mutually beneficial relationships over time. Alumni take part in arranging workshops to the students in their respective concerns. So that a student can make the performance with the same motive by having exposure to these practices, students can get prone towards the learning by improving performance rich session. 2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1

Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences and teachers use ICT- enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning process

Response:

The college plans and organizes the teaching, learning and evaluation schedules according to the guidelines provided by Ranchi University. Support structures and systems are available for teachers to develop skills like interactive learning, collaborative learning and independent learning. The college makes efforts to ensure students’ growth and development in a congenial classroom atmosphere. Students are provided opportunities for academic interactions such as workshops and group discussions which help in interactive and collaborative learning. Digital Library facility is provided to all students as per norms decided by the library committee of the college.

The college takes various steps that complement teaching and learning experiences:

Inter-faculty interaction between the students and faculties from various departments are organized. Debate, essay writing, poetry recitation and poster making competitions are organized to develop creativity skills among students.

Inter-disciplinary educational association (**IDEA**) which imparts value education to students is also organized by the Institution.

Educational tours, excursions and field trips by various departments like Department of Geography conducted numerous tours of various place such as Puri, Digha, Kolkata, Sundarbans, Jaipur, Jaisalmare, Delhi, etc. in order to enhance the knowledge of students.

Technologies and facilities available and used by the faculty for effective teaching:

Computer Lab and high speed internet facility is available in the campus.

Automated Library facility is available so as to enable students and staff to get access to the books they need quickly.

Faculty members use audio-visual aids to enhance the teaching-learning process.

Class wise and section wise WhatsApp groups have also been created to speed-up the teaching-learning process. Students are given the facility to post their queries in these groups which is resolved in time by the teachers. Some topics of arts and commerce stream are explained to students in the smart class room.

College also conduct numerous activities which make student enable to be active and prompt. We also focus on the four skill session or activities in our smart class randomly or time to time such as listening, speaking, reading and writing. In listening classes or activities we play any audio or video and give our students some specific task to complete with-in the allotted time frame. While, in speaking classes we usually allow our students for introductory session or warm-up activity and make them enable for presentation skills.

College also conduct some class of reading skills, which are completely based on paragraph reading, short stories and some specific poetry. In such classes, we allows student to read loudly and individually, after that we usually try to correct their error and improve their pronunciation. Usually, in writing activities we give our student to complete some specific write-ups and paragraph in a time bound manner.

All the previously mentioned skill classes are completely based upon student centric method, as in that classes they use to participate actively. At the end of such class, we allow our students to discuss their problems occurred in the on-going classes with the teachers.

Response:

Ram Tahal Choudhary College, Ormanjhi Ranchi is an affiliated Unit of Ranchi University Ranchi. For internal assessment, the entire department usually conduct their sessional examination individually and the attendance of all the students is mandatory. The schedule of sessional examination has been decided as per the academic calendar of the affiliating university. Sessional examination and evaluation work is regulated by the college itself. The institution has a direct process of continuous internal evaluation to evaluate the learning capacities of the students. In all the subjects where practical exams are part of the curriculum, it is mandatory to submit a practical record that is evaluated and marks are added during the final consolidation of results. Periodical class tests are also conducted on regular basis which help the students in their preparation for the final exam. Teachers, who are in the examination panel of the college render their services in setting the question paper and evaluating, answer books. The evaluation process is transparent. The assessment work is carried out by the concerned subject faculty in the institution. The evaluation reports are prepared within the stipulated time and communicated to the students and suggest them necessary improvement steps. The external assessment is done as per the norms prescribed by the affiliating university. The examination schedule, examination paper, the centre of examination and the evaluation procedure are all managed by the University. For any student grievance, the college consider their problem and forward it to the concerned authorities of the affiliating universities and try to get it resolve in a timely manner.

Procedure for sessional exam:

- The time table is displayed on the College website and college notice board accordingly.
- The examination process is looked after by exam controller and examination cell.
- Invigilation duties are allotted to staff members.
- The answer sheets are distributed room wise along with question papers and attendance sheets by the invigilators.
- After examination, the answer sheets are collected by the invigilators and submitted to the Examination Committee for further process.
- The answer books are evaluated fairly in time and results are declared and displayed on the college notice board and mark foil is sent to the affiliating university.

Procedure for Practical Exams is as follows:

- It is compulsory to submit their practical record with in the stipulated time frame.
- Preparation of time table and student list by the respective departments.
- The appointment of external and internal examiners from university panel.
- Examination, viva-voce is conducted and marks submitted to university through channel online.

The Program outcomes and course outcomes are accomplished through course curriculum as prescribed by the affiliating University. Course outcomes are defined for each course and they are mapped accordingly. A set of performance evaluation criteria is used for quantitative assessment of COs. Thus the listed COs provides an evidence of attainment of POs and COs into two types of methods namely direct methods and indirect methods.

Direct Methods :- Showcase students' knowledge and skills through various assessments and projects providing a comprehensive understanding of their abilities and learning progress. The direct methods enable students to evaluate their knowledge and skills in a comprehensive manner, class tests are the common methods used by the college to measure students understanding of subject or topic. Continuous Internal Assessments (CIA) is also conducted in mid of every semester, which plays a crucial role in evaluating student's progress throughout the program. CIA includes assignments, presentation or group discussions allowing students to demonstrate their understanding and application of concepts in more interactive way.

Practical assessments are also part of the evaluation of the goals. They provide students with hands-on experience and assess their ability to apply theoretical knowledge. These assessments involve performing tasks or experiments related to the subject matter where-in students demonstrate practical skills, problem solving abilities and critical thinking. These laboratory assignment enables students to engage in experiential work involving performing experiments, data analysis and drawing conclusions their after.

Projects are also assigned to the students, it is comprehensive assessment that encourages students to apply their knowledge and skills-set to complete a significant task or solve a real world problem. Projects allow students to show case their creativity, critical thinking and project management skills.

Presentation Metrics assess students communication and subject knowledge while seminars cover current topics or in depth core course ensuring students understanding and engagement.

End-semester examinations are used to assess COs using descriptive question, which focuses more on attainment of COs. By using these direct methods faculty members gain comprehensive understanding of student's abilities. These assessments provide valuable insights into students learning progress, strengths and areas of improvement.

- Financial Assistance to Conduct the staff exposure programme and Tour Teaching and Non-Teaching.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

Ram Tahal Choudhary College has an effective mechanism for Internal and External Audit. The accounts of the Institute are audited by chartered accountants regularly as per the Government rules. Whenever there are additional expenses over and above the budget proposals, special sanction is to be taken from the approval authority of the management. The Accounting and Auditing Committee looks after the internal audit and it is presented to the certified Chartered Accountant.

Internal Audit:

The Institute has a finance committee and appointed a qualified Auditor and also forms a team of staff under them to do a methodical verification on a periodic basis. The purpose of internal audit is to provide an objective source of information to the management with a view to efficient conduct of activities of the institute, safeguarding assets, preventing and detecting fraud and other unlawful acts, completeness & accuracy of financial records and timely preparation of financial statements. Internal Audit is done by checking each bill and vouchers, books/laboratory equipment and other materials are purchased at a least price taking proper quotation collected from the parties.

External Audit:

The external auditor is appointed by the college to perform audits of the financial statements of the Institute. The financial records are audited by qualified chartered accountants at the end of each financial year. The financial records are certified i.e., income and expenditures, balance sheet and notes on accounts. The institution publishes audited financial statements on the institution's website as the information for the concerned people.

Our College mobilizes its funds received mainly from students as fees. Apart from students fees resource funds generated from above are principally used for maintenance and development of the institute.

Optimal utilization of resources:

- Sufficient funds are allocated for effective teaching-learning practices that include training programmes, orientation programmes, workshops, and interdisciplinary activities.
- Budget is utilized to meet day to day operational and administrative expenses and maintenance of fixed assets.
- Requisite funds are utilized every year towards enhancement of library facilities to augment learning facilities.
- Adequate funds are utilized for development of and maintenance of infrastructure of the institute.
- Some funds are utilized for community development and social welfare activities.

The GB of the college monitors the use of the resources received from the fee collection through

discussion with the members of GB. The IQAC looks into the effective and efficient use of financial resource through continues meeting.

Proper management of finance is the stepping stone for institutional development. Optimal utilization of funds is in garden maintenance and plantation of new plants. Payments of salary to faculties of different departments. Use of funds in purchase of teaching learning aids, organising seminars, national conferences and workshops. The college handles the student fund with proper planning. In order to find out authenticity of expenditure, the Institution conducts internal and external audit to maintain transparency.

Main motto of resource mobilization and utilization of resources is to put Institute on standard with a view to achieve best quality teaching and unique quality of students.
